UI Health FY18 Goals:

1. QUALITY & SAFETY

- Reduce sepsis mortality.

2. PATIENT EXPERIENCE

• Improve composite Press Ganey top box mean score for the following five areas: inpatient, ambulatory clinics, emergency department, ambulatory surgery, and diagnostic departments.

3. OPERATIONS

- Decrease overall emergency department length of stay.
- Reduce percent of clinic "no-shows."
- Increase adherence to using two forms of identification.

4. FINANCIAL PERFORMANCE

- Improve net patient revenue.
- Improve inflation-adjusted operating cost per case mix adjusted discharge.

In early June, new patient gowns were distributed to hospital inpatient units. Patient feedback from Press Ganey surveys revealed the old patient gowns were difficult to put on and keep closed. This resulted in a lack of privacy, modesty, and incorrect sizing. The new gowns feature:

- Thicker material
- Larger telemetry pockets
- Color-coded side-tie closures that allow for appropriate sizing
- UI Health branding



New Patient Transfer Device Now Available

The Sara Stedy transfer device is now available for use on Floors 4-8. This versatile device is easy to use and can help improve employee and patient safety during transfers. In late June, hundreds of nurses and nursing techs were trained on using the device. Staff from Nursing Clinical Practice and Professional Development and University Health Service collaborated to make the launch a success. This device is part of the new initiatives introduced by the UI Health Safe Patient Handling and Mobility program.



UI Health Receives Grant for 'Dandle Roo' NICU Device

Congratulations to Laura Lewis, OTD, OTR/L, who received a grant approval from the Friends of Children's Hospital University of Illinois specifically to purchase the Dandle Roo Positioning Devices for the NICU. This device greatly enhances positioning options and ease with many benefits for babies' development. The Dandle ROO was developed by NICU professionals to support the neurodevelopment of the preterm and ill infant and supports prone, supine, and side-lying positions all in one device.
